

## Adobe Premiere Pro CS6 Train the Trainer Overview

I. The purpose of this document is to outline what to expect in an Adobe Premiere Pro CS6 Train the Trainer session. This program is designed for instructors seeking to participate in the Adobe Certified Instructor Program as an instructor for Premiere Pro CS6.

Each instructor candidate participating in a Train the Trainer (T3) is expected to:

- a. Attend for the **full** duration of the training event and present part of each course as one step in the Instructor Certification process.
- b. Be prepared with the course materials prior to the training event
- c. Be a full participant in the Adobe Certified Instructor Program. Program details may be found on the <u>program information page</u>
- d. Have passed the Premiere Pro CS6 ACE exam before attending the T3 Note: ACI status is not a personal credential, but part of a structured training program with a set of requirements and benefits.
  - II. The ACI process for Adobe Premiere Pro CS6 includes the following:
    - a. Pass Premiere Pro CS6 ACE exam
    - b. Attend a Premiere Pro CS6 Train the Trainer
    - c. Pass stand up certification as part of the Train the Trainer
    - d. Complete the ACI online program application

    - a. The Managing Master Instructor and other instructor candidates will provide feedback during the session
    - b. Final certification outcome will be sent by Adobe to each candidate
